Academic support:

At Isle Study Centre we support children with their academic progress. This could be to maintain engagement with specific subjects to ensure no gaps in learning when they reintegrate back into mainstream school. We offer 1:1 tutoring with English and Maths Functional Skills and GCSE.

Students who are able are offered the opportunity to sit formal exams at either Functional Skills level or GCSE. They will then sit their examinations at Tutors & Exams in Doncaster. Students who are not ready or unwilling to sit exams are taught Life Skills English and Maths.
